LOCATION OF PROPERTY TAKEN BY RIGHT OF EMINENT DOMAIN

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that New England Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, and having a place of business located at Portland, in the County of Cumberland, in the State of Maine, being duly authorized to construct and operate telephone lines in Township Nine (9), Range Five (5), W.E.L.S. in said Aroostook County, and being authorized by Section 27 of Chapter 50 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1954, to take and hold as for public uses, land necessary for the construction and operation of its lines, hereby takes and holds as for public uses and in the exercise of the right of eminent domain, the land hereinafter described, the same being necessary for the construction and operation of its lines of telephone:

√ A certain lot or parcel of land situated in Township Nine (9), Range Five (5), W.E.L.S. in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pipe set in the ground in the southwesterly side line of State Highway Route Number Eleven (11), said iron pipe being twenty six hundred and twenty five (2625) feet southerly (measured along said highway) of the Houlton Brook, so-called, where said brook crosses said highway, said iron pipe being also approximately two miles (measured along said highway) from the intersection of said highway with the south line of said Township Nine (9), Range Five (5), W.E.L.S.; thence from said iron pipe running at right angles to said highway, South 76° West, one hundred (100) feet to another iron pipe set in the ground; thence turning and running North 14° West, one hundred (100) feet to another iron pipe set in the ground; thence turning and running North 76° East, one hundred

(100) feet to another iron pipe set in the ground in the said southwesterly side line of said highway; thence turning and running South 14° East in said side line of said highway, one hundred (100) feet to the point of beginning.

The aforescribed lot of land is owned in common and undivided as follows:

One sixth (1/6) in common and undivided by Stephen Phillips, of Salem, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts;

One sixth (1/6) in common and undivided by said Stephen Phillips, Stephen Wheatland of Sorrento, in said State of Maine, and David P. Wheatland of Cambridge in said Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in their capacity as trustees under the will of Ann Maria Wheatland, deceased;

Two-thirds (2/3) in common and undivided by said Stephen Wheatland, said David P. Wheatland, Lucia P. Fulton, of Hamden, in the State of Connecticut, Anna W.
